

"Mr. Woolsey was promoted to agent-operator at Woolsey in September 1911 and has always displayed the greatest energy, efficiency, and loyalty in connection with his work. The fire prevention inspectors declare that the entire station, including platform and underneath the building, is a model of neatness and that it would be difficult for a fire to start either inside the building or underneath it."
