

Dr. I. G. Woolsey Dead.

Last Thursday night at 10 o'clock Dr. I. G. Woolsey passed peacefully away at his home in Woolsey after an illness of several weeks.

Dr. Woolsey has been a very prominent citizen of this county for the past 20 years. He was by birth a Kentuckian. He moved to Butts county in 1864, and lived there until about 20 years ago when he moved to this county, and has since resided at what is now known as Woolsey, which was named after him.

He was in his 74th year, and was married twice, his first wife preceding him to the great Beyond about 35 years. His last wife survives him and four children of his first wife, Mr. C. R. Woolsey, Mr. I. G. Woolsey, Jr., Mrs. J. T. Lewis, of Fayette county, and Mrs. James Woolsey, of Butts county.

Dr. Woolsey was a very prominent physician and for many years had a very large practice, until the infirmities of old age and bad health came upon him. He was a preacher and was for many years a leading preacher of the Baptist churches in this section, being pastor of the Fayetteville church for several years. He was also prominent in masonic circles, and in all things for the good of his community and county, he was for it always.

The funeral and interment was at Woolsey Sunday morning, Rev. E. M. Hooten, of Fairburn officiating. He was buried with masonic honors, and a very large concourse of people followed the remains to their last resting place.
